Key Elements of Health in All Policies

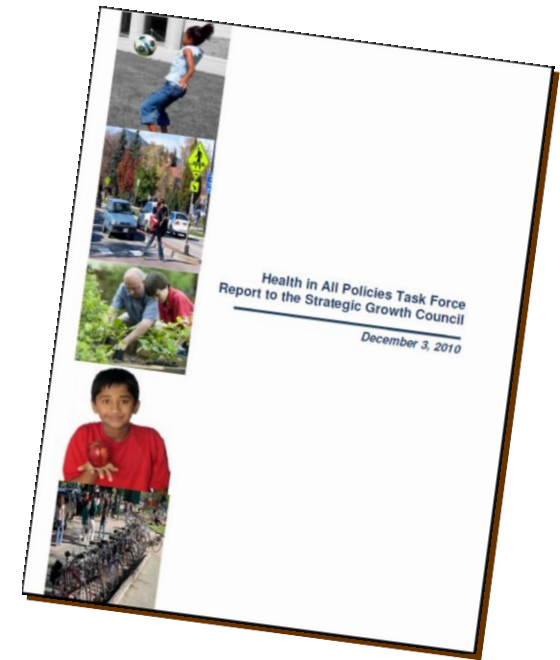


-  Promotes health and equity

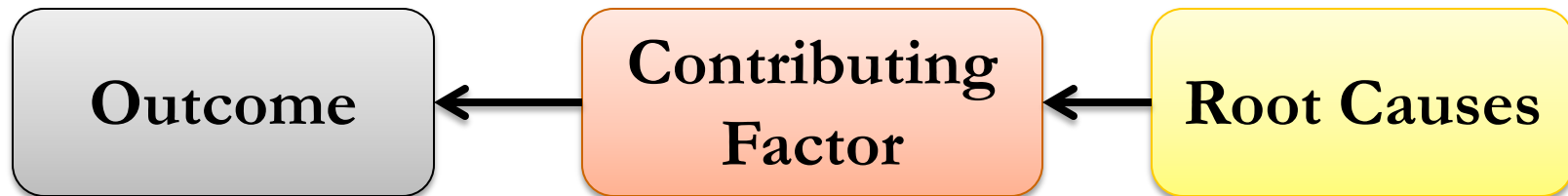


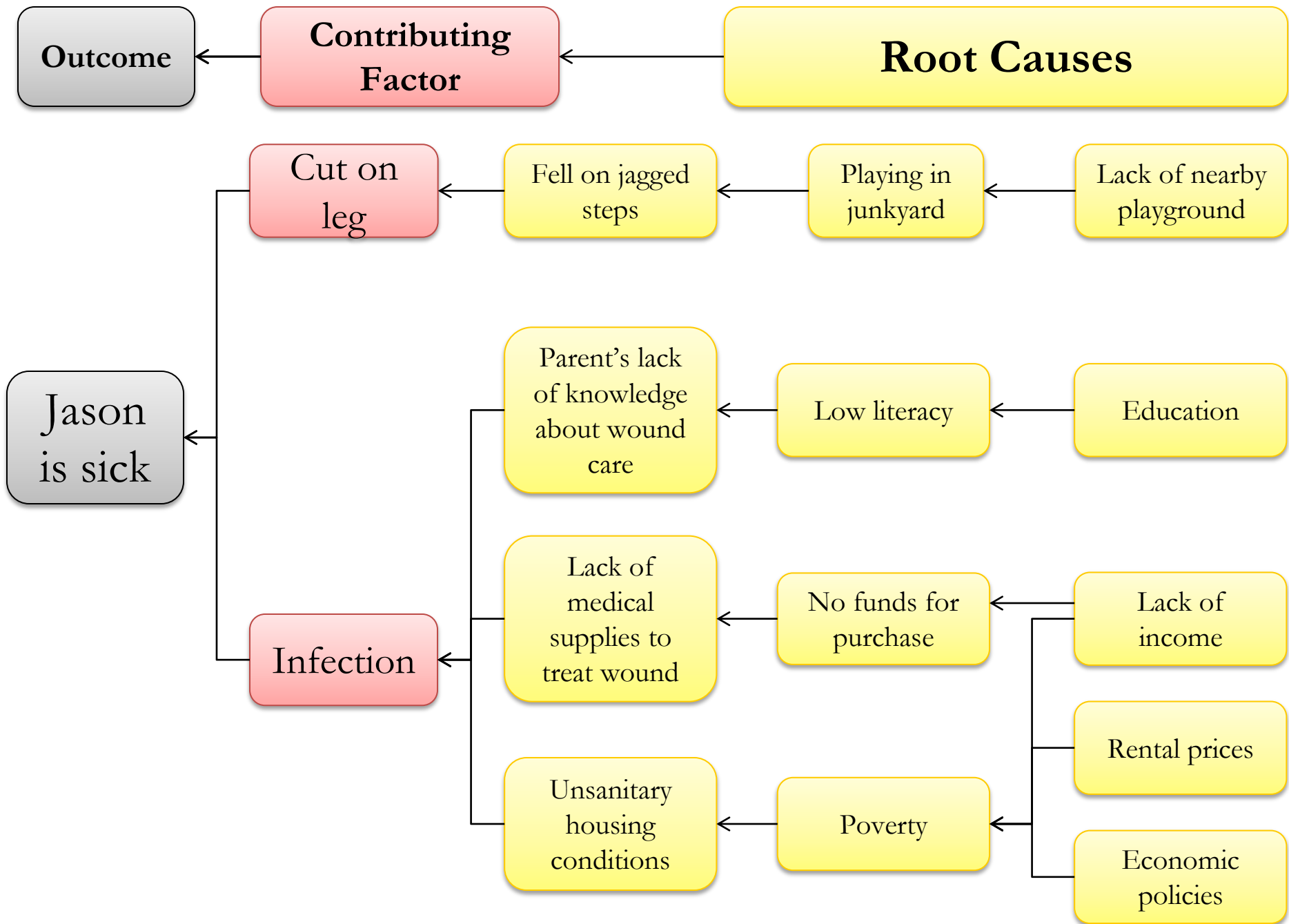
